


We have created a memorial park in Fergus Falls, Minnesota to remember and honor all children who have died, regardless of age or reason.



## The History of Angel of Hope

The Angel of Hope Memorial Park (Christmas Box Angel Monument) located at Adam's Park (Grotto) in Fergus Falls is a part of an international network of memorial parks that provide a place of comfort and hope to parents and family members who grieve the loss of a child. There are over one hundred such parks in existence. The initial memorial statue and subsequent memorial parks were inspired by the book "The Christmas Box" by author Richard Paul Evans.

**HOPE** is a rare gift that, if we are lucky, comes to us with the power to heal our lives. I've come to know that the deepest sense of hope often springs from the hardest lessons in life. It is in the darkest skies that stars are best seen ... perhaps it is divine irony that within the darkest moments we are capable of revealing the greatest light, demonstrating what is best with humanity.

### ANGEL OF HOPE AT A GLANCE

- The park is funded by private memorials, fundraising efforts, donations and grants.
- The Angel of Hope Memorial Park serves as a place where families can go to reflect, find comfort and peace after the loss of a child. The network of Angel of Hope Memorial Parks has been a significant blessing for many thousands of people since the first memorial was dedicated on December 6, 1994, in Salt Lake City, Utah.
- A common element of all of the Angel of Hope Memorial Parks is a bronze cast angel with uplifted wings. The word "hope" is always inscribed on the angel's right wing.
- The park has the Angel of Hope statue as the central figure, surrounded by pillars of granite that is inscribed to memorialize loved ones from the surrounding area.
- The cost to purchase a memorial is \$150 and may be purchased by parents or grandparents.
